Committee Reports

Maintenance

The work of the maintenance committee is behind the scenes: putting down gravel, managing dead brush and vegetation, bush hogging the growth that gradually impinges on the trail, and keep the trail safe and pleasant. Washington & Lee student volunteers spread 8 tons of gravel as part of W&L Nabors Day in March. In May, cadets helped weed, clear brush, and add even more gravel to the Trail. We partnered with the Native Plants Virginia Society's Upper James River chapter to help maintain the vegetation the wildflower section of the Trail. Our new bike station is in place, and quite a few bicyclists have made use of it. The Buena Vista kiosk is now up and finished, as is the information sign at Reid's lock. The old "W" marker was recovered and reinstalled after being lost for decade. Two owners whose property adjoins the trail are working with the Friends to do maintenance and make improvements to their sections of the Trail. If your property or neighborhood abuts the trail, we would love to have you work with us, too!

Race

The Chessie Trail Marathon gets more successful every year, and 2023 proved to be our biggest race yet. There were 663 registrants from 25 different states for a remarkable total of 6450 miles run. The youngest participant was 5, the oldest was 80, and the most interesting runner juggled three balls for the whole race! Volunteers spent countless hours filling race packets, monitoring registrations, supplies, ordering food and performing last-minute tasks like clearing cow piles and giant black walnuts from the route. More than \$10,000 was spent on local businesses and vendors, and the race netted \$16,181 for maintenance and improvements on the trail.

Outreach

Between March and November, the Outreach Committee participated in 15 community events, including community festivals, student and employee wellness fairs, wildflower walks, and trail scavenger hunts. We worked with W&L, VMI, Southern Virginia University, the Outdoor Adaptive Recreation group, Historic Lexington Foundation, Virginia Native Plant Society, Celebrate Rockbridge, Rockbridge Community Festival, and Downtown Buena Vista. We also taped a short video for the Community Foundation Annual Meeting. This accounted for 45 extra volunteer hours by ten board members and 1 Friends member. In 2024, we plan to get more general members involved in our community outreach activities to spread the word about this great resource.



Board Development



On the Chessie


Trail Thoughts
